We regret to note that official information has been received notifying the death of Piper Alex. Clunie (Corporal, Cameron Highlanders), husband of Margaret Wallace, 162 Main Street, and son of Mr. and Mrs. Clunie, 29 Ronald Street, Coatbridge. He was reported missing on 3rd May, 1917, and is now reported to have been killed on that date. Deceased, who was 24 years of age, was employed at Barrhead when he was called up. He was well known and highly respected in Coatbridge and was a popular member of the St. John's Church Lads' Brigade Pipe Band and the Coatbridge Pipe Band.
