KILLED IN ACTION.

Mrs. Robert Docherty, 5 Coats Street, Coatbridge, has received official information that her son, Pte. Wm. Docherty, H.L.I., has died from wounds received in action in France on 21st June. Deceased enlisted 18 months ago, and at that time was employed by Mr. M'Creadie as an insurance agent. This is the second son of this family killed in action, while other two are still serving.
