Brother of Private Robert Grant of the 10th Battalion Highland Light Infantry who was Killed in Action at Loos on the 25/09/1915 (see index). Another 3 brothers were serving in November 1916. ROSEHALL BROTHERS KILLED.
 Mrs. R. Grant, 35 Mid Row, Rosehall, has received official information that her husband, Private Robert Grant, H.L.I., who was reported missing at Loos, is now believed to have been killed in action on that date, 25th September, 1915. Deceased, who is survived by a widow and four children, was a miner employed in Rosehall Colliery. His brother, Private Samuel Grant, H.L.I., was killed in action on 18th July. He was 21 years of age, and resided with his sister-in-law, Mrs. Grant, at 35 Mid Row, Rosehall, Whifflet, and was a miner at Rosehall. There are other three brothers still in the firing line.
