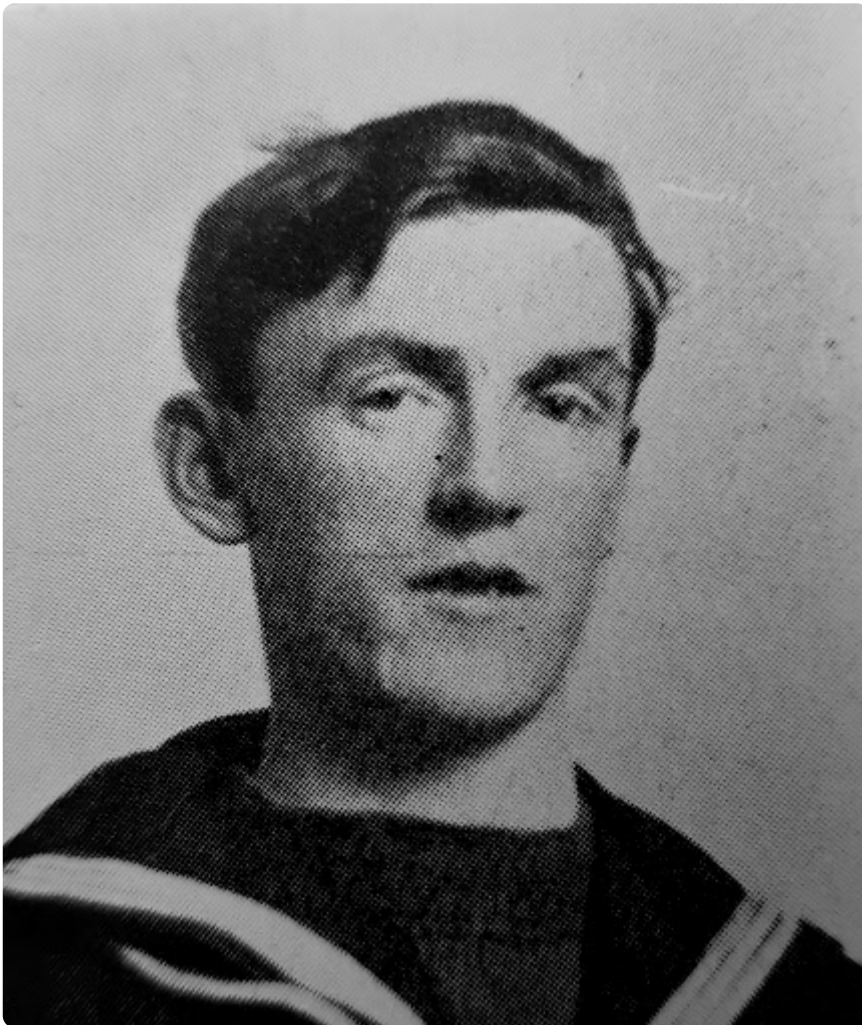

PRIVATE JOHN LINDSAY KILLED.

Mrs. Lindsay, 73D Buchanan Street, has received official information that her son, John Lindsay, R.N.D., was killed in action on 5th February. Deceased enlisted at the outbreak of the war. His brother George is serving with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.

Coatbridge Express 28/02/1917

Mrs Lindsay, 73 Buchanan Street, has received intimation from the War Office that her son John, who was in the Royal Naval Division, was killed in action on 5th February. Deceased was 21 years of age, and enlisted when war broke out. Mrs Lindsay has a son, George, serving in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.
