Additional Information

James was Killed in Action at the Battle of Ramicourt during the 3rd Battle of Ypres. James was formerly with the Highland Light Infantry (23427). Also remembered on the St Patricks Church and Stewarts and Lloyds Roll of Honour along with his 2 brothers (see photos)

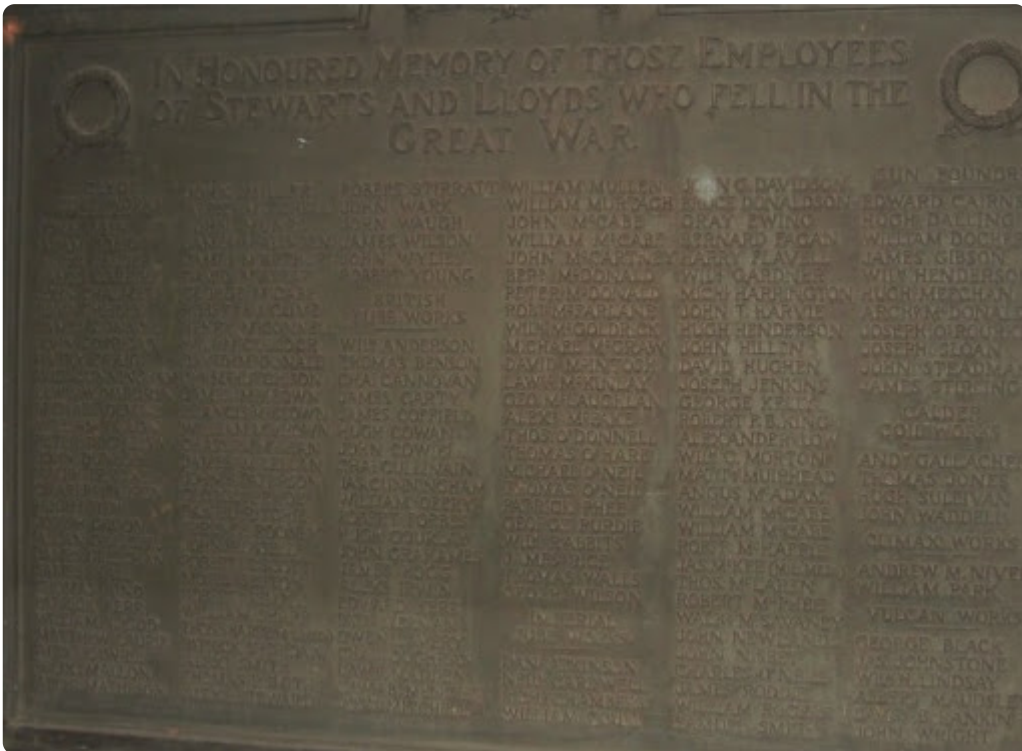
KILLED IN ACTION.

Mr. and Mrs. James M'Keown, Coats Place, Coatbridge, have received official information that their son, Private James M'Keown, North Staffordshire Regiment, was killed in action on 3rd October. Before enlisting deceased was employed with Messrs. Stewarts and Lloyds, Ltd. There are other four sons of this patriotic family serving and one missing, a record worthy of note.
