Thomas was previously wounded at Loos in 1915. His brother Bernard fell here. I personally laid a Poppy at Thomas` grave in 2008 (see main grave photo). His grave inscription reads " ON WHOSE SOUL SWEET JESUS HAVE MERCY R.I.P. "

PRIVATE THOMAS QUINN KILLED IN ACTION.

Official news has been received that Pte. Thomas Quinn, aged 19 years, Seaforth Highlanders, has been killed in action in France on December 30th, 1916. He enlisted along with other two brothers at the beginning of the war. All three fought at Loos, where Thomas was wounded; Bernard, Gordon Highlanders, killed; while James, Royal Scots Fusiliers, came through safe, and is still fighting in France. The parents reside at 2c North Butt Street, Whifflet.

WHIFFLET BROTHERS' RECORD.

Mr and Mrs Quinn, 2c North Bute Street, Whifflet, have been informed that their son, Private Thomas Quinn, Seaforth Highlanders, was killed in action on 30th December. He was only 19 years of age, and enlisted with two brothers at the beginning of the war. All three took part in the battle of Loos, where Thomas was wounded, and Bernard, Gordon Highlanders, killed. The other brother, James, Royal Scots Fusiliers, was unharmed, and is still fighting.
