Family Information

Son of Mr and Mrs William Robertson of 44c Main St, Coatbridge. Husband of Annie Nichol Robertson of 28 Hallcraig St, Airdrie. Father of 2 children. 2 of Roberts 3 brothers also fell. Both on the 25/09/1915 at the Battle of Loos. They were Private John R Robertson of the 11th Battalion Highland Light Infantry (see index) and Private Thomas C Robertson of the 9th Battalion Black Watch (see index). Another brother William also served and survived the war. In his Will dated 13/01/1917 Robert left the whole of his property and effects to his wife

Additional Information

THREE BROTHERS KILLED.

Mrs. Robertson, 23 Hallergig Street, Airdrie, has received official intimation that her husband, Pte. Robert Robertson, Royal Scots Fusiliers, has died of wounds received in action on the 24th April. Before enlistment he was employed in Airdrie Bolt Works. Two other brothers were killed at Loos, and the fourth son has just been transferred from Egypt to France. He enlisted on 11th December, 1914, and has come through most of the heavy fighting. He leaves a wife and two children. He was a son of Mrs. Wm. Robertson, 440 Main Street, Coatbridge.
