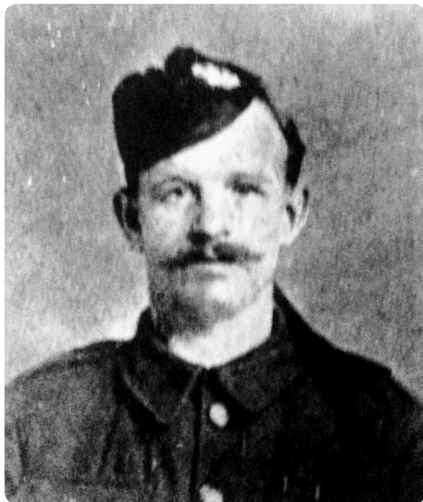


Sergeant John Cochrane

18th (Service) Battalion (Glasgow Yeomanry) Highland Light Infantry Service No: 37787 previously 8972

Killed in Action on the 25/03/1918 at the 1st Battle of Bapaume (part of the 1st Battles of the Somme 1918), age 35 / DOB - 26/11/1882. Eldest son of James (1861 - 1951) and Mary Ann Hastings Cochrane (1863 -). Husband of Annie Cummings Cochrane (03/02/1887 - 1963) of 37d Whifflet St (Revie's Land), Coatbridge. Father of 5 children.

John had 3 brothers. John's younger brother Private William Cochrane of the 1st Battalion Seaforth Highlanders was Killed in Action on the 05/11/1917 aged 28. His brother-in-law Private George Cummings of the 12th (Service) Battalion Highland Light Infantry Died of Wounds on the 20/05/1916 aged 27. Brothers - George Cochrane (1885 -), Andrew Cochrane (1888 -) and William Cochrane (1890 - 1917). Children - Alexander Cochrane (25/10/1904 - 27/09/1969), Jean Cochrane (02/01/1916 -), Christina (Tinny) Cochrane (06/03/1912 -), John Cochrane (14/08/1910 -) and Annie Cochrane (07/04/1908 -). John's Pension was awarded to his wife Annie on the 16/12/1918. Their 5 children are also listed. Employment was Miner previously a Labourer
