Killed in Action on the 25/09/1915 near Cambrin on the opening day of the Battle of Loos, age 35 / DOB - 21/05/1880. Son of Thomas Turnbull (18/04/1845 - 17/11/1919) and Mary McEwan Cowan (16/03/1849 - 09/07/1928) of 9b Baird St, Coatbridge. Henry was born in the Asylum where his father worked. Brother Thomas Cowan (25/01/1868 - 15/04/1926), Sister Mary Ritchieson Cowan (31/12/1870 - 1951), Brother Henry McEwan Cowan (12/03/1873 - 10/04/1875), Sisters Lilas Turnbull Cowan (29/05/1875 - ), Ellen Cowan (16/09/1877 - ), Jessie Cowan (1883 - ), Janet Cowan (1883 - 1975), Margaret McEwan Cowan (16/06/1885 - 1955), Jane Cowan (1888 - ).

From the 1901 Census - Address - Asylum North Lodge, Larbert, Stirlingshire - Thomas Cowan aged 55, Mary McEwan Cowan aged 52, Nellie Cowan aged 23, Henry Cowan aged 21, Jessie Cowan aged 18, Maggie Cowan aged 15, Jeanie Cowan aged 2. Henry's Pension was awarded to his mother Mary on the 22/07/1917. Employment was Miner in Bedlay Colliery.
