



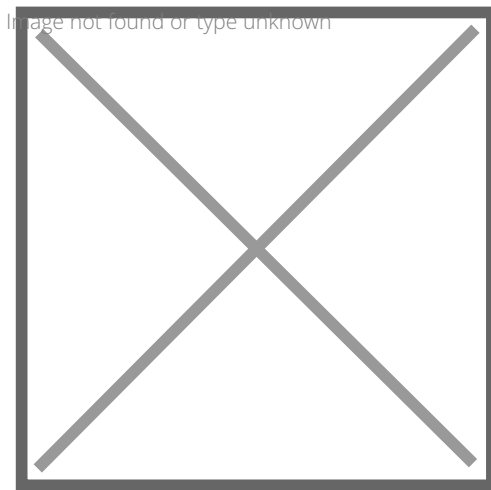

Killed in Action on the 27/06/1915 in reserve on the Canal Bank near Zwaanhof Farm, North East of Ypres, age 27. Son of William and Mary Cunningham Cree of 2 West Shaw St, Kilmarnock then Tichfield St, Kilmarnock. From the 1891 Census - Address - 13 Neephill Row, Kilmarnock, Ayrshire - William Cree aged 27, Mary C Cree aged 25, Thomas Cree aged 3, Dennis Cree aged 2, Margaret Cree aged 1 month. From the 1901 Census - Address - 8 Kiln Row, Kilmarnock, Ayrshire - William Cree aged 35, Mary Cree aged 33, Thomas Cree aged 13, Dennis Cree aged 12, Maggie Cree aged 10, Kate Cree aged 8, George Cree aged 4, Joseph Cree aged 2, Archibald Cree aged 1 month. Thomas' Pension was awarded to his mother Mary of Tichfield St, Kilmarnock on the 16/02/1917. Employment was Miner in Rosehall Colliery.
