



Private Charles Cullinan

1st Battalion Prince of Wales's Leinster Regiment (Royal Canadians) Service No: 3716

Died of Wounds on the 07/05/1915 during the 2nd Battle of Ypres, age 40 / DOB - 14/03/1875. Son of Patrick and Ann (Annie) Lynch Cullinan of Claureen House, Ennis, Co. Clare. Charles' younger brother Private John Cullinan of the 2nd Battalion Royal Munster Fusiliers (6476) Died of Wounds on the 18/05/1915 aged 35. He is NOT on the Memorial as he didn't leave from Coatbridge. Charles' brother John's Pension was originally awarded to his wife on the 18/02/1916 but she had died on the 27/08/1908. Their daughter Mary is also listed. It was then awarded to their mother Annie on the 30/08/1916. Another brother is also listed. Private Peter Cullinan (5786) of the 2nd Battalion Royal Munster Fusiliers then (89413) 29th London Regiment. Peter was discharged on the 29/09/1918 suffering from gunshot wound to his right leg. Employment was Tube Worker in the British Tube Works.
