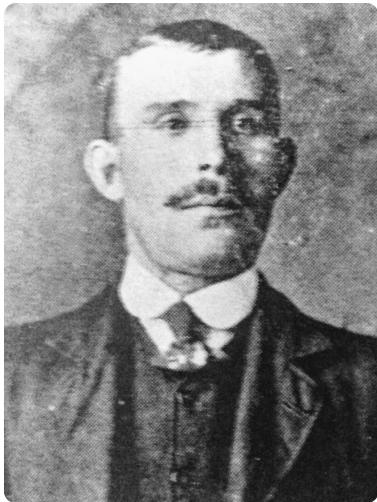

**Samuel Joseph Falls**

**1st Battalion Scots Guards  
Service No: 11097**

Killed in Action on the 27/09/1915 at the Hulloch area during the Battle of Loos, age 26 / DOB - 11/08/1889. Son of John Falls and Margaret Keys Falls of the Blue Doors, Killymoon, Cookstown, Co.Tyrone. Samuel's older brother Private Robert Falls (7881) of the 2nd Battalion Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers (4th Division, 12th Brigade) was Killed in Action on the 26/08/1914 at the Battle of Le Cateau aged 29. The Battalion arrived at Le Havre on the 23/08/1914 and Robert fell 3 days later. He is NOT on the Coatbridge Memorial. Samuel's father died in 1900. From the 1901 Ireland Census - Address - 10 Killymoon Demense, Cookstown - Margaret Falls aged 40, Robert Falls aged 17, Samuel J Falls aged 12, Irwin Falls aged 10, Margaret Falls aged 6, George Falls aged 5, Isabella Falls aged 3, Teresa Falls aged 1 (see photos). From the 1911 Ireland Census - Address - 10 Killymoon Demense, Cookstown - Margaret Falls aged 48, Samuel Falls aged 21, Irwin Falls aged 20, Margaret Falls aged 16, George Falls aged 15, Isabella Falls aged 12, Theresa Falls aged 10. Samuel and Robert's Pension was awarded to their mother Margaret. Employment was Iron Worker with William Baird and Company, Gartsherrie. Previously a Labourer in Cookstown, Co. Tyrone.
