Lance Corporal John Faulds

13th (Service) Battalion Royal Scots (Lothian Regiment) (Machine Gun Section) Service No: 15662

Killed in Action on the 23/04/1917 at the 2nd Battle of the Scarpe (phase of the Battle of Arras), age 36. Son of Robert and Margaret (Maggie) Faulds of Gartsherrie. Brother of Mrs Annie Faulds Tunnicliffe of 43 West George St, Coatbridge. In his Will dated 20/07/1915 John left all his property and effects to his sister. From the 1881 Census - Address - No 3 Sunnyside Terrace, Coatbridge - Robert Faulds aged 38, Maggie Faulds aged 35, Annie K Faulds aged 7, Robert Faulds aged 5, Maggie Faulds aged 3, John Faulds aged 2 months. From the 1891 Census - Address - Sunnyside Terrace, Coatbridge - Robert Faulds aged 47, Margaret Faulds aged 44, Annie Faulds aged 17, Robert Faulds aged 15, Maggie Faulds aged 13, John Faulds aged 9, George Faulds aged 5. From the 1901 Census - Address - 10 Sunnyside Buildings, Coatbridge - Robert Faulds aged 59, Robert Faulds aged 25, Margaret Faulds aged 23, John Faulds aged 20, George Faulds aged 15. John's Pension was awarded to his sister Mrs Annie Tunnicliffe on the 29/01/1919. Employment was Union Tube Works.
