



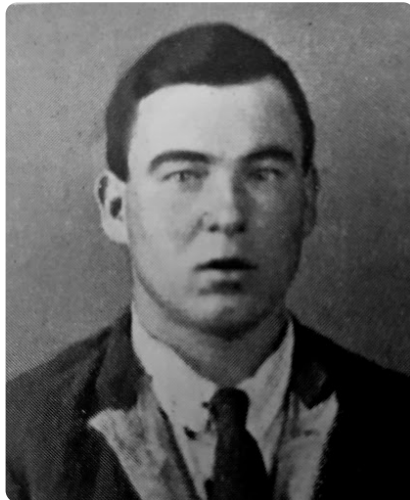

Died on the 06/06/1918 of Broncho Pneumonia at home (17 Coathill St, Coatbridge), age 25 / DOB - 24/02/1893.  
Son of William and Susan Forsyth. James' father was a Colliery Fireman. James' younger brother Able Seaman William Forsyth died aboard H.M.S. "Natal" on the 30/12/1915. Another brother Henry was also with the Royal Naval Division. From the 1901 Census - Address - 112 Whifflet St, Coatbridge - William Forsyth aged 43, Susan Forsyth aged 43, Agnes Forsyth aged 17, Henry Forsyth aged 13, George Forsyth aged 10, James Forsyth aged 8, William Forsyth aged 3, James' fathers mother-in-law Ann Graham aged 79. Employment was Miner with the Hutton Rig Coal Company, Bellshill.
