Died on the 13/10/1918 of illness in the Military Hospital, Curragh, Ireland, age 47 / DOB - 17/03/1871. Son of Philip and Margaret Fotheringham. Husband of Mary Fotheringham (15/06/1874 - 06/09/1923) who was born in Co. Antrim. Father of 5 children. From the 1901 Census - Address - Main St, Falkirk, Stirlingshire - William Fotheringham aged 30, Mary Fotheringham aged 27, Philip Fotheringham aged 7, Maggie Fotheringham aged 5, Richard Fotheringham aged 3, Janet Fotheringham aged 9 months, brother David Fotheringham aged 23. From the 1911 England Census - Address - 278 Winwick Rd, Warrington, Lancashire - William Fotheringham aged 40, Mary Fotheringham aged 36, Maggie Fotheringham aged 15, Janet Fotheringham aged 10, Robert Fotheringham aged 8, visitor Daniel McConnachie aged 40, servant Sarah Ann Clarey aged 18. William's Pension was awarded to his wife Mary on the 16/05/1919. Employment was Iron Moulder in Warrington, Lancashire.
