Killed in Action on the 09/05/1915 on the opening day of the Battle of Aubers, age 21. Son of James and Agnes Fraser of Broomfield Terrace, Airdrie. Archie's mother received the news of his death exactly a fortnight after his marriage to Agnes Clothier in Airdrie, the ceremony having taken place before the Sheriff on the 29/04/1915. Archie's brother Private James Fraser, No. 3 Section, Royal Engineers 1st (Lowland) Field Company was at home suffering from a severe wound in the left hand caused by a shrapnel bullet. Archie's Pension was awarded to his wife Agnes c/o Clothier of 8 Mavisbank Place, Airdrie and also listed as 42 Helenvale Terrace, Gartocher Road, Shettleston, Glasgow. Child named Archibald Brown Clothier born 15/07/1915 also listed on the Pension Record. Archie's Pension was awarded on the 27/11/1915. Employment was No data
