Killed in Action on the 25/04/1915 near Wieltje at the Battle of St. Julien (part of the 2nd Battle of Ypres), age 32 / DOB - 16/03/1883. Son of William and Margaret Johnston Arnott. Husband of Lily Hamilton Arnot (01/03/1891 -). Father of William (07/07/1909 -), James (26/01/1913 -) and Elizabeth (21/03/1914 -). Alexander's older brother Private James Arnott of the 11th (Service) Battalion Highland Light Infantry was Killed in Action on the 25/09/1915 at Loos. Alexander's Baptism Record - Name : Alexander Johnston Arnot. Gender : Male. Birth Date : 16 March 1883. Baptism Date : 23 April 1883. Baptism Place : Free Church, Bathgate, West Lothian, Scotland. Father : William Arnot. Mother : Margaret Johnston. From the 1891 Census - Address - Bridgend, Bathgate - William Arnot aged 41, James Arnot aged 10, Alexander Arnot aged 8, Annie Arnot aged 5. Alexander's Pension was awarded to his wife Lily of 198b Bank St, Coatbridge on the 16/11/1915. Their 3 children are also listed. Employment was Rosehall Colliery / Student at the School of Mining.
