Killed in Action on the 20/09/1917 at the Battle of Menin Road Ridges (part of 3rd Battle of Ypres / Passchendaele), age 27. Son of Miller Anderson Gilchrist and Jane Gilchrist of 2 Springfield Place, Stirling. He was a lodger with Mrs Pearson at 10 Wallace St, Coatbridge. From the 1891 Census - Address - 98 Craigs, Stirling - Miller Gilchrist aged 36, Jane Gilchrist aged 35, Mary Gilchrist aged 13, David Gilchrist aged 11, Jane Gilchrist aged 9, Miller Gilchrist aged 7, Ellen Gilchrist aged 3, James Gilchrist aged 1. From the 1901 Census - Address - 5 Springfield Place, Stirling - Jane Gilchrist aged 45, Mary Gilchrist aged 23, David Gilchrist aged 21, Jane Gilchrist aged 19, Miller Gilchrist aged 17, Helen Gilchrist aged 13, James Gilchrist aged 11, Elizabeth Gilchrist aged 9, Agnes Gilchrist aged 6. Employment was Grocer with the Co-Op Society.
