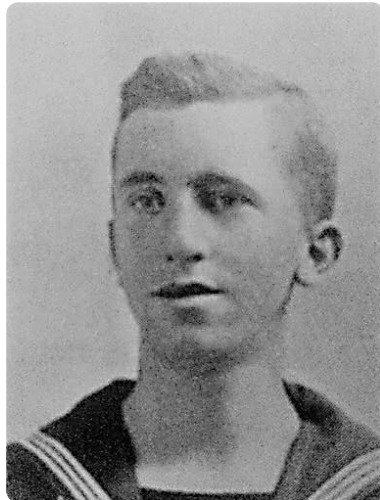

Died on the 14/10/1918 of acute pneumonia at Crescent War Hospital, West Croydon, Surrey, age 22 / DOB - 21/01/1896. Youngest son of John Gray (1846 - 20/02/1921) and Jeanie (Jane) Risk Gray (1858 - 15/09/1907) of 49d Bank St, Coatbridge. From the 1891 Census - Address - 3 Cameron St, Coatbridge - John Gray aged 42, Jane Gray aged 32, Elizabeth Gray aged 12, Mary Gray aged 8, Jane Gray aged 7, John Gray aged 5, From the 1901 Census - Address - Watson's Land, Burnside St, Coatbridge - John Gray aged 53, Jane Gray aged 43, John Gray aged 15, James Gray aged 5. James' Pension was awarded to his father John on the 26/06/1919. Employment was Waverley Iron Works.
