Died on the 07/10/1915 after a leg amputation at No.5 General Hospital Rouen, France. Wound received on the opening day of the Battle of Loos 25/09/1915, age 20. Only son of James Hutton and Sarah Gray of 15h Douglas St, Coatbridge. Only match on the 1901 Census ? - Address - 4 Clydeside Terrace, Old Monkland West District - James A Gray aged 43, Sarah E Gray aged 35, Eunice Gray aged 7, James A Gray aged 6, Jeanie Gray aged 1 and visitor William Hackney aged 37. James' Pension was awarded to his father James on the 27/04/1918 then his stepmother Christina on the 18/04/1927. Employment was Puddler in the Waverley Iron Works.
