Killed in Action on the 09/04/1917 at the 1st Battle of the Scarpe (opening day of the Battle of Arras), age 41. Son of James and Margaret Mullholland Gray. Elder brother of Private Thomas Gray of the 16th (Service) Battalion (2nd Edinburgh) Royal Scots who was Killed in Action on the 26/04/1917 at the Battle of Arras 17 days after his brother fell in the same battle. 5 brothers served from this family, 3 with the Royal Scots, 1 with the Royal Field Artillery and 1 with the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. From the 1891 Census - Address - 11 Kirkwood St, Coatbridge - James Gray aged 48, Margaret Gray aged 42, William Gray aged 16, John Gray aged 15, Robert Gray aged 13, Agnes Gray aged 12, Joseph Gray aged 9, Thomas Gray aged 7, Letitia Gray aged 6, David Gray aged 4, Peter Gray aged 2. From the 1901 Census - Address - 9 Kirkwood St, Coatbridge - James Gray aged 59, Margaret Gray aged 52, John Gray aged 25, Robert Gray aged 23, Joseph Gray aged 19, Thomas Gray aged 17, Letitia Gray aged 16, David Gray aged 14, Peter Gray aged 12, James Gray aged 8. Employment was Miner in Rosehall Colliery No 12 Pit (20 years).
