## Sergeant James Greene (Green)

## 1/9th Battalion (Glasgow Highlanders) Highland Light Infantry, HQ Company Service No: 331546

Died of wounds on the 15/09/1917 at No.10 Stationary Hospital, St. Omer. Wounds received by the bursting of a bomb whilst training recruits, age 23. Son of James and Mary Helen (Ellen) Greene of 181a Bank St, Coatbridge. James had 2 brothers serving, Corporal / Piper William (Willie) Greene in France and Corporal / Drummer Samuel Green who was in training at the time of James' death. Both were also in the Highland Light Infantry and were members of the Coatbridge Pipe Band. James is listed as GREEN on the Coatbridge Memorial, Census and Pension Records. From the 1901 Census - Address - 44l Woodside St, Coatbridge - James Green aged 39, Mary Helen Green aged 37, Sarah Jane Green aged 13, Margaret Green aged 11, William aged 8, James aged 8, George aged 4, Samuel aged 2, Hugh aged 1 day. James' Pension was awarded to his mother Mary and his father James on the 13/05/1919. Employment was with William Richmond, Spirit Merchants, Bank St.
