Died of Wounds 15/08/1918 at the 1st South African Field Ambulance, age 21. Son of William and Euphemia of 4e William St, Coatbridge. Younger brother of Private George Halbert of the 1/6th (Morayshire) Battalion Seaforth Highlanders who was Killed in Action on the 09/04/1917. From the 1901 Census - Address - 41 Watts Land, New Monkland - William Halbert aged 45, Euphemia Halbert aged 40, James Halbert aged 13, William Halbert aged 12, George Halbert aged 9, Euphemia R Halbert aged 8, Thomas Halbert aged 4, Archibald Halbert aged 5 months, visitor Agnes Henderson aged 51. Thomas' Pension was awarded to his sister Euphemia c/o Mrs Gow, 34 Montague St, Glasgow on the 21/02/1919. Employment was Speedwell Shell Works.
