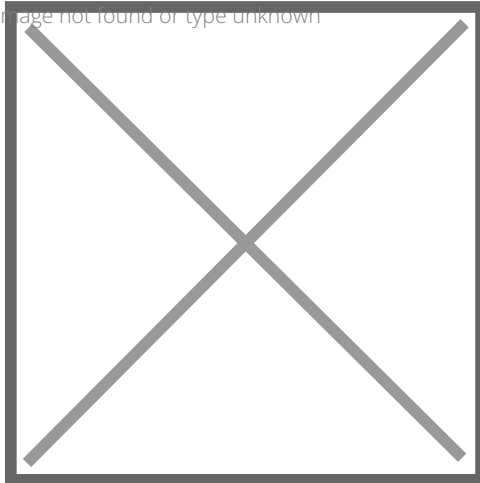

2nd Battalion Royal Scots (Lothian Regiment)
Service No: 11624

Killed in Action 16/05/1915 near Zillebeke, age 24 / DOB - 29/03/1891. Son of Nicol Hall and Mary Greenfield Hall of 23 Dunbeth Rd, Coatbridge. David's younger brother Alexander of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders was reported in a list of wounded in the Coatbridge Express 06/10/1915. David had 4 brothers serving in the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders one of whom was taken prisoner during the retreat from Mons in 1914 and another Walter (9860) of the 2nd Battalion who was discharged on the 28/02/1918 after serving for 4 years. From the 1891 Census - Address - Cemetery Rd, Dunfermline - Nicol Hall aged 33, Mary Hall aged 33, George Hall aged 13, John Hall aged 11, Nicol Hall aged 9, William Hall aged 6, Walter Hall aged 3, Agnes Hall aged 1, David Hall aged 1 week. From the 1901 Census - Address - 13 Ure St, Govan - Nicol Hall aged 43, Mary Hall aged 43, George Hall aged 23, Walter Hall aged 13, Agnes Hall aged 11, David Hall aged 10, Mary Hall aged 8, Alexander Hall aged 6, Victor Hall aged 3. David's Pension was awarded to his mother Mary of 3 Coltswood Road, Coatbridge. Employment was Locomotive Works, Kipps, Coatbridge. Also helped in his father's Scalemaker business.
