Killed in Action on the 14/09/1914 at the Battle of the Aisne, age 29 / DOB - 26/07/1885. Son of Richard Hamilton (1864 - 14/08/1943) and Mary Knox Hamilton (1867 - 16/02/1940) of 11 Hamilton St, Larkhall. Husband of Mary McDermid Hamilton (28/01/1888 - 18/09/1943) of 161 Sunnyside Rd, Coatbridge. Father of 4 children, Richard Hamilton born 23/10/1908, Martin McDermid Hamilton born 03/02/1910, Walter Miller Hamilton born 07/07/1912 and Alexander Hamilton born 10/08/1914 (his father enlisted when he was born and died 1 month later). From the 1901 Census - Address - 152 Sunnyside Rd, Coatbridge - Richard Hamilton aged 35, Mary Hamilton aged 33, Alexander Hamilton aged 15, Mary Hamilton aged 9, Richard Hamilton aged 6, Samuel Hamilton aged 4, William Hamilton aged 1. Alexander's Pension was awarded to his wife Mary on the 29/05/1915. The 4 children are also listed. Mary remarried David McOwat on the 28/08/1917. Employment was Rivet Worker in Lochrin Iron Works / Reservist.
