Machine Gun Corps (Infantry) 252nd Company Service No: 18530

Died on the 01/02/1919 in bed of natural causes in Northern Russia, age 33. Eldest son of David and Jane Ann Humm. Nephew of Samuel and Margaret Lindsay of Groveside Cottage, Kipps, Coatbridge. Elder brother of Sergeant Thomas Humm D.C.M. of the 2nd Battalion Black Watch who was Killed in Action on the 21/01/1916. David and his brother Thomas lived with their cousin Private Samuel P Lindsay (36522) of the 16th (Service) Battalion (2nd Glasgow) Highland Light Infantry who was Killed in Action on the 28/11/1917. David left a Will leaving all his property and effects to his aunt and uncle. From 1891 Census - Address - Broompark Pl, Stonefield Road, Blantyre - David Humm aged 47, Jane Ann Humm aged 37, Jane S Humm aged 7, David G Humm aged 6, Thomas Humm aged 3, Robert Humm aged 1.
