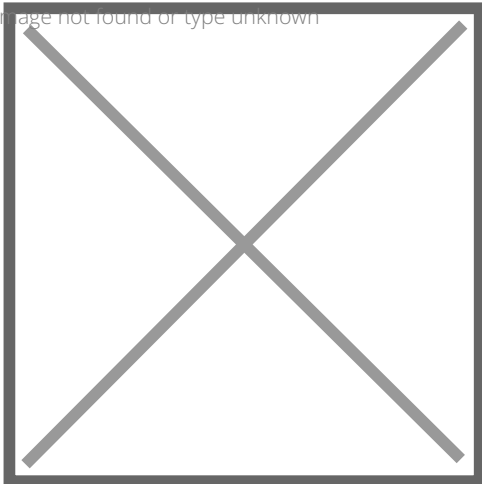

Killed in Action on the 09/05/1915 on the opening day of the Battle of Aubers, age 21. Son of Joseph and Mary Ann Kelly of 303g Main St, Coatbridge. From the 1901 Census - Address - 2 Stable Row, Coatbridge - Joseph Kelly aged 36, Mary Ann Kelly aged 53, Joseph Kelly aged 13, Mary Ann Kelly aged 9, George Kelly aged 7, Emma Jane Kelly aged 4, Sarah Kelly aged 2, lodgers John Walker aged 34, Catherine Walker aged 30, Eliza Jane Walker aged 3, Robert John Walker aged 1. George also had sisters named Polly and Kathie. George's Pension was awarded to his mother Mary Ann on the 12/05/1916 then to his sister Kathie Kelly when his mother died on the 28/08/1924. Employment was Imperial Tube Works.
