



Private Joseph Bannan

9th (Service) Battalion Cameronians (Scottish Rifles) Service No: 12256

Killed in Action on the 03/05/1917 at the 3rd Battle of the Scarpe (part of the Battle of Arras), age 23 / DOB - /10/1893. Son of Robert (1864 - 03/12/1942) and Annie Jane Bannan (1866 - 03/04/1941) of 63a Hospital St, Whifflet, Coatbridge. Brother of John Bannan (18/06/1887 - 1954), Thomas Bannan (1890 - 19/06/1891) Born and Died - 45 Long Row Summerlee Old Monkland, Coatbridge, Robert Bannan (1894 - 1959), James Bannan (1895 - 1909), Patrick Bannan (1896 -), Elizabeth Bannan (11/03/1898 - 1972) Born - 16 Banknock Terr Haggs, Stirlingshire, Ann Jane Bannan (1/12/1899 - 1976), Francis Bannan (04/11/1901 -), Thomas Bannan (10/06/1903 -), William Bannan (07/11/1903 -), Mary Bannan (1905 - 1970) Born - Haddington, Prestonpans, East Lothian, Jane Bannan (1906 - 1907). Joseph's Pension was awarded to his mother Annie of 63a Hospital St, Coatbridge and was then given to his father Robert of 34c Wallace St, Coatbridge after his mother's death. Employment was Coal Heaver in Rosehall Colliery, Coatbridge.
