8th (Service) Battalion Black Watch (Royal Highlanders) "B" Company
Service No: S/6457

Killed in Action on the 14/07/1916 at Longueval during the Battle of Bazentin (part of the Battles of the Somme), age 19. Son of the late Robert and Victoria Loughan (Grant) of 67a Dundyan Rd, Coatbridge. Brother of Lance Corporal Charles Loughan of the 1st Battalion Leinster Regiment who was Killed in Action on the 30/01/1915. From the 1901 Ireland Census - Address - 31 Little Georges, Dock Ward, Antrim, Ireland - Robert Loughan aged 60, Victoria Loughan aged 40, Robert Loughan aged 20, Annie Loughan aged 16, Nathaniel Loughan aged 15, Charles Loughan aged 10, Margaret Ann Loughan aged 8, Patrick Loughan aged 6, Peter Loughan aged 4, Sarah Loughan aged 2. Peter's Pension was awarded to his mother Victoria on the 31/03/1917. Employment was Tinsmith in the Tinplate Iron Works.
