Lance Corporal Findlay (Finlay) Muir

13th (Service) Battalion Royal Scots Service No: 16766

Died on the 22/10/1915 by accident in France, age 21. Son of John and Isabella Jane (Jeannie) Muir of 16 Carridale St, Blairhill, Coatbridge. Findlay's younger brother Gunner Robert Muir of the Royal Field Artillery enlisted as soon as he heard his brother died. He was Killed in Action on the 15/11/1917. Another brother was serving with the Navy. In his Will dated 30/09/1915 Findlay left the whole of his property and effects to his mother. From the 1901 Census - Address - 12 George St, Coatbridge - John Muir aged 34, Jane Muir aged 32, Findlay Muir aged 6, Robert Muir aged 4, John Muir aged 2, Alexander Muir aged 3 months, boarders George Muir aged 22, James Muir aged 21. Findlay's Pension was awarded to his father and mother but solely to his father John after the death of Jane. Employment was Ironmongers Assistant with Nelson and Clelland Ironmongers
