





Gunner Robert Muir

Royal Field Artillery "A" Battery 50th (Howitzer) Brigade Service No: 104390

Killed in Action on the 15/11/1917 near the Belgian coast, age 21 / DOB - 25/10/1896. Son of John and Isabella Jane (Jeannie) Muir of 16 Carridale St, Blairhill, Coatbridge. Robert's older brother Lance Corporal Findlay Muir of the 13th Battalion Royal Scots was accidentally killed in France on the 22/10/1915. Robert enlisted soon after. Another brother was serving in the Navy. From the 1901 Census - Address - 12 George St, Coatbridge - John Muir aged 34, Jane Muir aged 32, Findlay Muir aged 6, Robert Muir aged 4, John Muir aged 2, Alexander Muir aged 3 months, boarders George Muir aged 22, James Muir aged 21. Robert's Pension was not issued. See Pension Records (lists only Robert's brother Findlay received a Pension). Employment was Shop Worker with Mr Cooper, Sunnyside Rd, Coatbridge
