



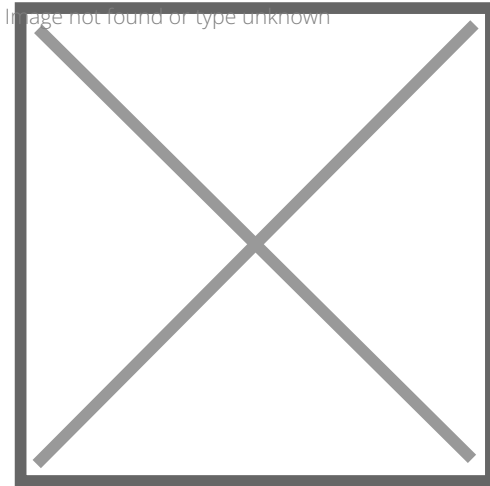

Killed in Action / Died of Wounds on the 17/02/1915 at Cuinchy, age 24. Son of John and Josephine Murtagh of New Cottages, Duleek St, Drogheda, Co. Louth. From the 1901 Ireland Census - Address - Priests Lane, Westgate, Drogheda No. 3., Louth, Ireland - John Murtagh aged 35, Josephine Murtagh aged 30, William Murtagh aged 12, Thomas Murtagh aged 7, Josephine Murtagh aged 5, Mary Christina Murtagh aged 2. William left all his property and effects to his mother. William's Pension was awarded to his mother Josephine on the 16/05/1916.
Employment was Tube Worker in the British Tube Works
