



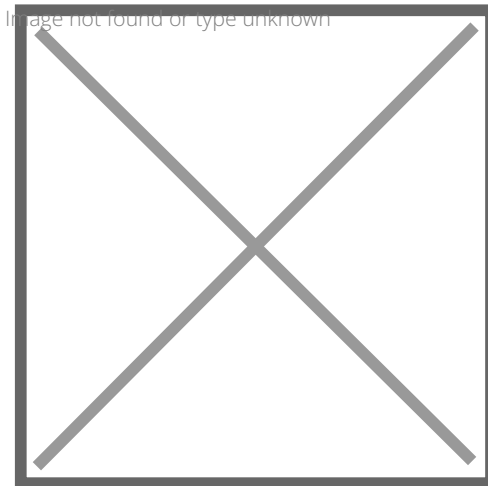

Killed in Action on the 12/10/1915 near Zillebeke, age 31. Son of John and Margaret McAvoy. Husband of Sarah McAvoy (10/07/1870-) and father of 2 children, Alice Bruce McAvoy born 14/12/1912 and John McAvoy born 12/03/1914. From the 1891 Census - Address - 14 Trafalgar St, Bridgeton, Glasgow - John McAvoy aged 32, Margaret McAvoy aged 28, Joan McAvoy aged 8, John McAvoy aged 7, Margaret McAvoy aged 5. John's Pension was awarded to his wife Sarah on the 10/07/1916 (her 46th Birthday). Guardian Sister Frances Ames from Smyllum Orphanage, Lanark is also mentioned. Sarah remarried and became Sarah Glynne of 75 East Nelson St, Glasgow. Employment was Carter
