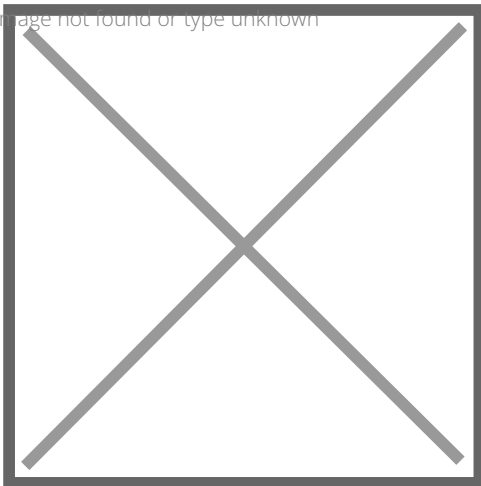

Killed in Action on the 25/09/1915 near Cambrin on the opening day of the Battle of Loos, age 29. Son of John and Ellen of 314 Main St, Coatbridge. William made a Will leaving all his property and effects to Mr John McCabe of 314 Main St, Coatbridge. William's elder brother Lance Corporal George McCabe (8012) of the 2nd Battalion King's Own Scottish Borderers was Killed in Action on the 23/04/1915 aged 30. Both brothers have no known grave. From the 1891 Census - Address - Crookedholm, Kilmarnock - Wm McCabe aged 31 ?, Ellen McCabe aged 29, Ellen McCabe aged 9, George McCabe aged 7, William McCabe aged 5, Michael McCabe aged 3, David McCabe aged 1, George's grandmother Ellen Gilchrist aged 60. From the 1901 Census - Address - 159h Whifflet St, Coatbridge - John McCabe aged 41, Ellen McCabe aged 40, Ellen McCabe aged 19, George McCabe aged 16, William McCabe aged 15, David McCabe aged 11, Catherine McCabe aged 9, John McCabe aged 7, Sarah McCabe aged 5, Michael McCabe aged 2, James McCabe aged 1. William's and his older brother George's Pension was awarded to their mother Ellen (listed as Helen). Employment was British Tube Works
