Bernard McFarlane

2nd Battalion Cameronians (Scottish Rifles)

Service No: 7889

Died of Wounds on the 16/03/1915 at No 2 Stationary Hospital, Outreau, Boulogne. Wounds received at the Battle of Neuve Chapelle., age 34 / DOB - 23/10/1881. Son of James and Catherine McDonald McFarlane of Cookstown, Co. Tyrone. Brother of Mrs Ellen Plunkett of 160 Garngadhill, Townhead, Glasgow. Bernard's brother Private Robert McFarlane of the 12th (Service) Battalion Highland Light Infantry was Killed in Action on the 25/09/1915 on the opening day of the Battle of Loos. From the 1891 Census - Address - 69 Bank St, Coatbridge - James McFarlane aged 38, Catherine McFarlane aged 38, James McFarlane aged 19, Catherine McFarlane aged 15, Elizabeth McFarlane aged 13, Bernard McFarlane aged 9, Edward McFarlane aged 5, Robert McFarlane aged 3, Ellen Jane McFarlane aged 1. In his Will dated 07/03/1915 Bernard left all his property and effects to Miss McFarlane of 38 Buchanan St, Coatbridge. Employment was North British Iron Works / Reservist
