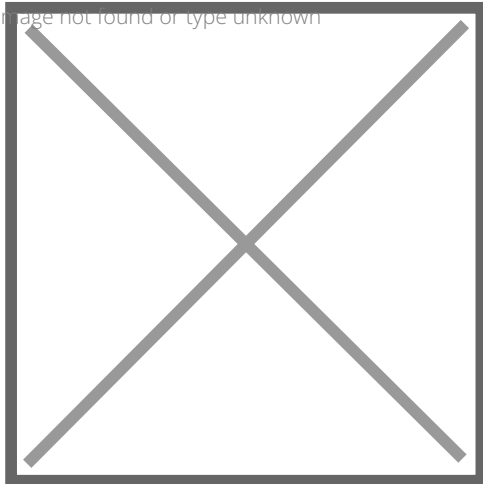

Killed in Action on the 25/09/1915 on the opening day of the Battle of Loos, age 27 / DOB - 16/10/1887. Son of James and Catherine McDonald McFarlane of Cookstown, Co. Tyrone. Brother of Mrs Ellen Plunkett of 160 Garngadhill, Townhead, Glasgow. Robert's brother Private Bernard McFarlane of the 2nd Battalion Cameronians Died of Wounds on the 16/03/1915. From the 1891 Census - Address - 69 Bank St, Coatbridge - James McFarlane aged 38, Catherine McFarlane aged 38, James McFarlane aged 19, Catherine McFarlane aged 15, Elizabeth McFarlane aged 13, Bernard McFarlane aged 9, Edward McFarlane aged 5, Robert McFarlane aged 3, Ellen Jane McFarlane aged 1.
