Killed in Action on the 11/04/1917 at the 1st Battle of the Scarpe (part of the Battle of Arras), age 27. Son of William and Margaret of 17b Coatbank St, Coatbridge. Thomas' brother Private Donald McIntosh of the 2nd Battalion Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders was Killed in Action on the 25/09/1915. From the 1901 Census - Address - Bogside Row, Coatbridge - William McIntosh aged 47, Margaret W McIntosh aged 58, Janet McIntosh aged 14, Thomas McIntosh aged 11, Catherine McIntosh aged 9, Donald McIntosh aged 7, William McIntosh aged 5, James McIntosh aged 1. Thomas' Pension was awarded to his father and mother. Employment was Kipps Locomotive Works
