




## Private James McSherry

## 6th (Service) Battalion King's Own Scottish Borderers Service No: 32548

Killed in Action on the 30/09/1918 near Klephoek during the Battle of Ypres 1918 (part of the Final Advance in Flanders), age 19 / DOB - 03/08/1899. Son of Michael and Catherine Glancey McSherry. James' older 2 brothers Gunner Stephen McSherry (75100) and Gunner Michael McSherry (75099) served with the Royal Field Artillery and both survived the war. Michael was with the Royal Field Artillery in 1913 and then joined the 10th (Service) Battalion Highland Light Infantry (12385) at the outbreak of war. Father Michael and brothers Michael and Stephen mentioned in the 1901 Census - Address - 16 F3 East Stewart St, Coatbridge - John McKeown aged 35, Catherine McKeown aged 34, James McKeown aged 11, Francis McKeown aged 6, William J McKeown aged 4, boarders Michael McSherry aged 39, Stephen McSherry aged 14, Michael McSherry aged 12. James' Pension was awarded to his mother Catherine. Employment was Tube Worker in the Caledonian Tube Works
