Died of Wounds on the 12/01/1918 at No. 44 Casualty Clearing Station. Wounds received the previous day near Passchendaele Ridge, age 20. Only child of David Ogilvie and Mary Ogilvie of 35 Church St, Coatbridge (the address listed after Mary's death is 27 Chassels St, Coatbridge). From the 1901 Census - Address - 16 Dunbeth Road, Coatbridge - David Ogilvie aged 34, Mary Ogilvie aged 28, William Ogilvie aged 3. William's Pension was claimed by his mother Mary and then by his father David after Mary's death. On William's Pension Record (1) it states - "If refused : reason". It then states "Refusal : N.P.D". This means "No Pension Due" or "Not Payable Due" . This indicates that the Pension claim was rejected as the individual was not eligible for a Pension. Employment was R and W Campbell, Ingram St, Glasgow
