





Private John Paterson

2nd Battalion Highland Light Infantry Service No: 12965

Died of Wounds on the 09/07/1916, age 41. Son of John and Janet Paterson. Husband of Margaret Paterson (11/03/1879 -) of 20a1 Whittington St, Coatbridge. Father of 3 children and stepfather of 1, William Paterson born 05/12/1904, Christina Arbuckle Paterson born 06/12/1908, Mary Arbuckle Paterson born 23/04/1911 and John's stepson Robert Brown aged 4 on the 1901 Census. John's brother Private Alexander Paterson of the 1/9th (Highlanders) Battalion Royal Scots was Killed in Action on the 01/08/1918. Another brother also served. From the 1891 Census - Address - 218 North Square, Gartsherrie, Coatbridge - John Paterson aged 60, Janet Paterson aged 46, Isabella Paterson aged 17, John Paterson aged 15, Robert Paterson aged 12, William Paterson aged 10, Alexander Paterson aged 7. From the 1901 Census - Address - 104/3 Sunnyside Road, Coatbridge - John Paterson aged 24, Margaret Paterson aged 24, John's stepson Robert Brown aged 4. John's Pension was awarded to his wife Margaret of 28 Whittington St, Coatbridge on the 16/01/1917. His 3 children are also listed. Margaret remarried Patrick Kerrigan on the 16/02/1918. Employment was North British Iron Works
