Adam Boyd

6th (Service) Battalion Cameron Highlanders Service No: S/11391

Killed in Action on the 09/10/1916 in the Village of Le Sars during the Battle of Transloy (part of the Battles of the Somme), age 31 / DOB - 01/09/1885. Son of William Boyd (1862 - 12/10/1913) and Jane Boyd (1866 - 1898). William remarried Elizabeth Boyd and they lived at Hopeton St, Gourock. Adam's Will dated 08/07/1915 left everything to his younger brother Wallace Boyd c/o Richardson, 7 Adelaide St, Gourock. Private Wallace Boyd, 34th Battalion Machine Gun Corps (119060) was Killed in action on the 16/04/1918 aged 25. Adam's younger brother Private John Boyd, CCLVIII (1/3rd Highland) (Howitzer) Brigade, Royal Field Artillery was reported missing (see Newspaper clipping). From the 1891 Census - Address - 3 Salmon St, Greenock - William Boyd aged 28, Jane Boyd aged 24, Adam Boyd aged 5, John Boyd aged 3, William Boyd aged 11 months. From the 1901 Census - Address - 9 Adelaide St, Inverkip, Gourock - William Boyd aged 38, Elizabeth Boyd aged 36, Adam Boyd aged 15, John Boyd aged 13, William Boyd aged 11, Wallace Boyd aged 8. Adam's brother Wallace's Pension was awarded to his wife Matilda of 7 Willisons Lane, Port Glasgow on the 09/11/1918. Their 2 sons are also listed. Employment was Clyde Tube Works.
