Killed in Action on the 09/10/1916 at the Battle of Transloy (part of the Battles of the Somme), age 29. Son of William and Elizabeth Boyd. Adam's Will dated 08/07/1915 left everything to his younger brother Wallace Boyd c/o Richardson, 7 Adelaide St, Gourock. Private Wallace Boyd, 34th Battalion Machine Gun Corps (119060) was Killed in action on the 16/04/1918 aged 25. From the 1901 Census - Address - 9 Adelaide St, Inverkip, Gourock - William Boyd aged 38, Elizabeth Boyd aged 36, Adam Boyd aged 15, John Boyd aged 13, William Boyd aged 11, Wallace Boyd aged 8. Adam's brother Wallace's Pension was awarded to his wife Matilda of 7 Willisons Lane, Port Glasgow on the 09/11/1918. Their 2 sons are also listed. Employment was Clyde Tube Works.
