



Private Robert Glass Robertson

1st Battalion Royal Scots Fusiliers Service No: 15825

Died of Wounds on the 24/04/1918 at the 26th General Hospital at Etaples. Wounds received during the Battles of the Lys, age 35. Son of William Robertson and Helen Robertson of 44c Main St, Coatbridge. Husband of Annie Nichol Robertson (05/10/1889 -) of 23 Hallcraig St, Airdrie. Father of 2 children, Christina Gillian Robertson born 14/10/1910 and William Robertson born 26/10/1913. Two of Robert's 4 brothers also fell. Both on the 25/09/1915 at the Battle of Loos. They were Private John R Robertson of the 11th (Service) Battalion Highland Light Infantry and Private Thomas C Robertson of the 9th (Service) Battalion Black Watch. Another brother William also served and survived the war. Walter was the only Robertson brother not serving. In his Will dated 13/01/1917 Robert left the whole of his property and effects to his wife. From the 1901 Census - Address - 62 Merrystone St, Coatbridge - William Robertson aged 52, Helen Robertson aged 48, William Robertson aged 24, Thomas Robertson aged 20, Robert Robertson aged 18, Walter Robertson aged 15, John Robertson aged 13, Kelly Robertson aged 10, Annie Robertson aged 7. Robert's Pension was awarded to his wife Annie on the 29/10/1918. Both children are also listed. Employment was Airdrie Bolt Works
