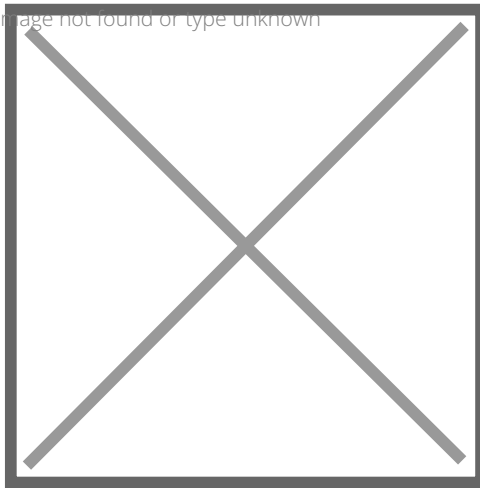

Killed in Action on the 07/06/1917 on the opening day of the Battle of Messines, age 20. Son of John Boyle and Elizabeth Boyle. From the 1901 Irish Census - Address - 56 Carrickbracken, Camlough, Co. Armagh - John Boyle aged 46, Elizabeth Boyle aged 45, James Boyle aged 20, Michael Boyle aged 18, Elizabeth Boyle aged 16, Mary Boyle aged 14, Bridget Boyle aged 13, Anne Boyle aged 8, Peter Boyle aged 5, Thomas Boyle aged 4. From the 1911 Ireland Census - Address - 50 Carrickbracken, Camlough, Co. Armagh - Elizabeth Boyle aged 53, Elizabeth Boyle aged 26, Minnie Boyle aged 24, Bridget Boyle aged 22, Annie Boyle aged 16, Peter Boyle aged 15, Thomas Boyle aged 14, Boarder Ellen Kane aged 24. Thomas' sister Miss Lizzie (Elizabeth) Boyle received his belongings after his death. She was also awarded his Pension. Employment was Labourer at Langloan Chemical Works. Previously worked in the Bessbrook Spinning Company, Co. Armagh
