Killed in Action on the 27/09/1915 at the Hulloch area during the Battle of Loos, age 23 / DOB - 07/01/1892. Son of Robert and Mary Whan of Straits, Lurgan Rd, Banbridge, Co. Down. Previously at Coolreaghs in Lissan Lower, Tyrone. Coolreaghs lies just north of Cookstown. From the 1911 Ireland Census - Address - Coolreaghs, Lissan, Co. Tyrone - Robert Whan aged 50, Mary Jane Whan aged 50, Emly Whan aged 24, William Whan aged 19, Thomas Whan aged 9, Herbert Whan aged 4, boarder Elizabeth McCormack aged 21, Mary Hayes aged 20. William's Pension was refused by his father. Pension states "does not wish to claim". Employment was Iron Worker with William Baird and Company / Agricultural Labourer aged 19
