Private William Wilson

36th Battalion Machine Gun Corps (Infantry) Service No: 124509

Died of Wounds on the 27/04/1918 at the 2nd Canadian Casualty Clearing Station, Esquelberq. Wounds received at the Battles of the Lys, age 27. Son of David Wilson and Margaret Wilson of 30 Laird St, Coatbridge. William's elder brother Private David Wilson (S/4028) of the 1st Battalion Black Watch (Royal Highlanders) Died of Wounds on the 18/06/1915. Elder brother Alexander was with the 10th (Service) Battalion Black Watch (Royal Highlanders). In his Will dated 25/01/1918 William left all his belongings to his father. From the 1901 Census - Address - 8a Carradale St, Coatbridge - David Wilson aged 48, Margaret Wilson aged 40, James Wilson aged 21, Alexander Wilson aged 16, Mary J Wilson aged 14, David Wilson aged 12, William Wilson aged 10. William's Pension was awarded to his father David on the 25/11/1918. Employment was Union Tube Works
